About the Castle

The castle was built in the mid-12th century by the archbishop of Salzburg and later transferred to the sovereign as a fief.

Between 1480 and 1486 was severely damaged. In 1880 it was converted into a residential castle. In 1957, after extensive renovation, Castle Forchtenstein was inaugurated as the first Austrian "Europahaus" (European House).

The Europäische Föderalistische Bewegung (EFB), Regional Association of Styria took over the castle in 1975 and held events such as panels on Europe, international youth meetings and seminars on minorities

In March 2018, Christoph Leitl established and co-financed Castle Forchtenstein as a public trust, and ever since then it is called "Europaburg" (Castle Europe) Forchtenstein.


